



## Advance Micro Credential Application Process & Timeline

The Advanced Micro-Credential (ADMC) will be made available to 24 candidates from Cohort I of Project I<sup>4</sup>. Participants who are selected be admitted to the ECU Department of Education EdD (education doctorate) and will earn 21 additional credits (EdD is a 60 credit degree). All EdD student dissertations must be focused on the Project I<sup>4</sup> work. Below is the timeline for application for the ADMC.

Decision will be made and candidates will be notified shortly after the first of April: candidates not selected for the ADMC may apply to the ECU on-campus EdD program (not grant funded).				

An important part of the application process will be your Project I<sup>4</sup> reflections and work with your EC-NICs (specifically coaches).

\* Each semester, students take two courses: **content course** and **design course** (which is the course devoted to the embedded dissertation).

\*\*By summer 2021 you will have 30 credits and you will need to take an additional 30 credits to complete your EdD. There will be an option to complete the EdD with the on-campus program OR if Project I<sup>4</sup> receives years 4 & 5 funding, we may be able to fund at least a portion of the remaining 30 credits. *Note*: NC residents will pay in-state tuition rates (approx. \$250/cr.) while non-residents will pay an an out-of-state rate (\$670/cr.)
