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Birth through Kindergarten- Self-Advising Checklist for Residency Licensure

There are two options for meeting the eligibility requirements for admission into the ECU Birth through Kindergarten Residency program. You will need to review your undergraduate degree awarded transcript to find a related academic major OR an unrelated academic major and 24 hours of content.

If you do not meet the eligibility requirements above and need to take courses to meet the 24-hour requirement the **possible** courses listed in the table below will assist you in your search for classes.. You may take these courses at a community college, ECU, or any other university with a BK program. Other courses may be used that align with the areas listed in Option 2 above but suggestions are here to get you started.

Please use the titles of the above courses as Key Words in your search for appropriate content courses. If you find any at our institution, the Office of Alternative Licensure can assist you with registration upon your admission to the university as a Visiting Student. Visiting students are not eligible for financial aid as you are not seeking a license and affiliated with our Residency Program. You would be classified as a Visiting Student until you are eligible to be a part of the Residency program and working towards licensure through our institution.

ECU will work to review your transcript(s) at the time that you have a LEA/EESLPD employer who wants to hire you as a Lead Teacher and you have reached 24 hours of content to enroll you into our Residency Program. ECU will accept grades of C or higher on coursework to determine meeting the 24 hour content requirement.
