

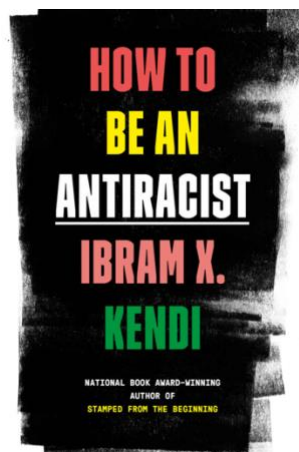

One either believes problems are rooted in groups of people, as a racist, or locates the roots of problems in power and policies, as an anti-racist. One either allows racial inequities to persevere, as a racist, or confronts racial inequities, as an anti-racist. There is no in-between safe space of not racist” (Kendi, 2019, p. 9).

Crossing

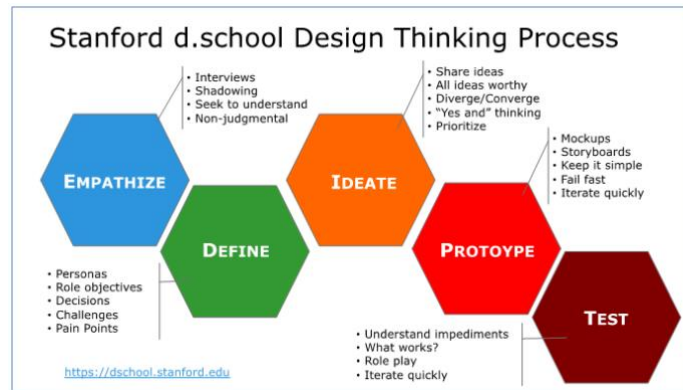
Jericho Brown

Than bravery. I don't march. I'm the one who leaps.

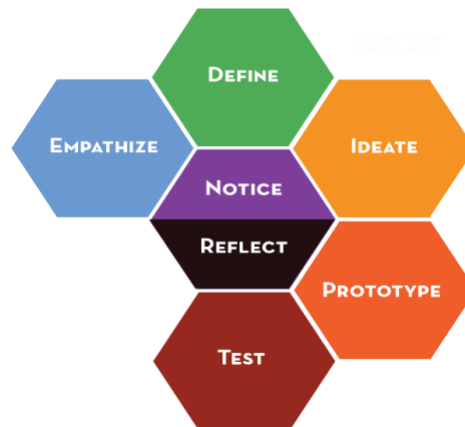
Design Thinking Resources

Many consider the **Hasso Plattner Institute of Design** at Stanford (commonly known as the Stanford D-School) the gold standard for design thinking. The original Design Thinking process has 5 steps.



In 2016, the d-School collaborated with the **National Equity Project** <https://nationalequityproject.org> and developed the Equity-Centered Design Framework.
